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Chateau Marjosse Blanc, Entre-deux-Mers, France, 2016

The boutique sized Marjosse property is owned and managed by one of Bordeaux's most gifted winemakers, Pierre Lurton of Cheval Blanc from which the wine quality clearly benefits. The powerful fruit aromas of grapefruit, pear and lychee are coupled with floral notes of juniper and laurel. The palate is crisp with a long creamy finish. Excellent with cold starters and fish dishes.



Domaine Ostal de Cazes 'Estibal', Languedoc Roussillon, France, 2015

Owned by Jean-Michel Cazes, also owner of Chateau Lynch Bages, Domaine de L'Ostal Estibals is the fruit of the collective parcels of the property in the Minervois appellation. A deep, bright garnet-red colour. The bouquet is intense, generous, Aromas of small berries. Smooth palate, with lovely freshness. A long, elegant finish.



M Chapoutier Hermitage Monier de Sizeranne, Rhone Valley, France, 2013

Aromas of red fruit (raspberry, blackcurrant) with a hint of liquorice. Good attack, round and elegant wine with concentrated and gentle tannins. The final is on blackcurrant, raspberry and spicy (pepper) aromas.

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Chateau de Rochemorin Blanc, Pessac-Leognan, France, 2014

The winemaking history of Rochemorin dates to the 15th century giving this glorious chateau an undisputable heritage of winemaking. The 2014 white offers beautiful aromatics and flavours. Honeysuckle, blackcurrant bud, pineapple, apple and pear flavours combine seamlessly on the palate. A judicious use of oak adds additional complexity to the medium weight mouthfeel. Versatile but excellent with seafood and light chicken dishes.



Château Haut Canteloup, Blaye Côtes de Bordeaux , France, 2014

Situated two miles north of the castle of Blaye, this estate's vintage delivered tannins as well as fruit here, with acidity and blackberry, spiced dark fruit. Good structure, round, full of cassis and cherry, smoked with hints of spice.



Pascal Jolivet Sancerre Blanc 'Sauvage', Loire, France, 2018

Great freshness with a rich, fine and complex aromatic profile. It reveals aromas of citrus, lime and mint, its nose is intense. This wine offers a beautiful vivacity, opulence and a lot of minerality followed by a slight salinity.

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Chateau Canon Montsegur, Bordeaux Superieur, France, 2015

This superb 18th Century noble house was formerly owned by the Archbishop de Solminihac of Angoulême. Today it produces an intriguing blend of Merlot and Cabernet Franc which offers a beautifully vibrant nose showing floral tones and juicy red fruits. The palate is soft and round thanks to the Merlot with expressive and fresh fruit, notes of mocha and gentle spice owing to the Cabernet Franc. An all-rounder which excels with red meat and hard cheeses.



Le Clementin du Chateau Pape Clement, Pessac-Leognan, France, 2014

Le Clémentin is the second wine of Château Pape Clément, a Bordeaux château dating back to the 13th century, whose then owner Bertrand de Goth became Pope Clement V, hence the name. The intense aromas of black cherry and cassis lead to a silky and complex palate rich in fruit and oak flavours. Excellent with duck and beef dishes.



M. Chapoutier Condrieu Invitare, Rhone, France, 2017

Deep gold, golden yellow with green lights. Very fruity, exotic fruit (pineapple), acacia blossom, litchee, apricot and peach. Round, full, good length in mouth with a final of vanilla.

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
