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Domaine de Rousset Vermentino, IGP Alpes-de-Haute-Provence, France, 2018 x 2

Chateau de Rousset from Haute-Provence has wines that are very unique in character. These wines have both Rhone and Provençal qualities. This wine has a fresh expression, voluptuous with a lot of finesse, perfumed and light, this is simply the perfect wine for aperitif. To enjoy with tuna salad, smoked salmon toasts or goat cheese.



Domaine de Rousset Syrah-Viognier, IGP Alpes-de-Haute-Provence, France 2016 x 2

This special blend is usually found in the Northern Rhone Valley. In Northern Provence, Thomas Emery has adapted this unique blend in his region, creating a lovely red wine where flower and tangerine notes of Viognier meet the black fruits and silky mouth of Syrah. This wine can be paired with saucisson, tapas, ham and cheese tarts.



Domaine Yannick Amirault - Le Grand Clos, Bourgueil, Loire, France, 2017 x 2

This Domaine was established in 1936 and is located on the right bank of the River Loire, overlooking the village of Bourgueil. An exhaustive wine in terms of both substance and form, with soft mentholated and rosewood marks. The tannic frame is thick and unctuous, with a salivating acidity. This refined mouth is a result of a high-class terroir.

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Domaine La Terrasse d'Elise - XB, IGP Pays d'Herault, France, 2017 x 2

Following the principles of organic and biodynamic farming, Xavier Braujou created the Elise terrace field in 1998, a vineyard of ten hectares on the great terroirs of Aniane. This wine comes with an aromatic nose of red and black fruits (redcurrant, blueberry and blackcurrant), cinnamon and coriander. On the palette it is fresh with persistent fruit.



Vignobles David Le Voyage d'Ulysse, Rhone, France, 2010 x 2

This is an organic wine produced in the Vallée du Rhône region in France, by Vignobles David. It comes fresh on the palate with red fruit aromas and an intense ruby-red colour with deep purple highlights. Pairs well with beef, lamb chop and aged cheese.



Chateau Villa Bel Air Rouge, Graves, Bordeaux, France, 2016 x 2

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Château Villa Bel-Air dates back to the 18th century and is located in the center of the Graves. The wine is made using traditional methods and the result is an exceptionally elegant Cabernet Sauvignon, the palate rife with flavours of blackberries, liquorice and a hint of vanilla and spices. The oak ageing adds good tannic structure to the wine.

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Guy Amiot Bourgogne Aligote Blanc, Bourgogne Blanc, Bourgogne, France, 2017 x 2

Aligoté is often called the "other white grape" in Burgundy and has a higher acidity than Chardonnay. It is rare to see vines as old as 80 years such as the Amiot family's. 2017 is a very good vintage thanks to a constant sun that grew sane, ripe and flavourful grapes.



Thibault Liger-Belair "LesDeuxTerres", Bourgogne Rouge, Bourgogne, France, 2017 x 2

The Cuvée Bourgogne les Deux Terres comes from this marriage between the crus du Beaujolais and the Bourgogne from Côte d'Or. This is a blend of only Crus du Beaujolais and Bourgogne Pinot Noir, in the following proportion: 85% Gamay, 15% Pinot Noir. A very elegant and drinkable vintage. The wine shows nice flavours of red fruits brought by round and elegant tannins.



Chateau Beaumont, Haut-Medoc, Bordeaux, France, 2014 x 2

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Located on the left bank of the Gironde, between the communes of Margaux and Saint-Julien, Château Beaumont draws its finesse and its delicacy from the deep gravels of the best soils of the Haut-Médoc. This wine has a deep ruby colour with a generous, fruity and complex nose. The attack is silky on the palate with a tannic structure present, all in balance. The lightly oaky fruit aromas are very elegant and contribute to the long aromatic finish.
